Requirements of Non-Iraqi Applicants Admission in preliminary studies for the University of Diyala

I. Admission Slots:

- 1. Valid programs and agreements with Arab and foreign countries (cultural exchange).
- 2. The sons and wives of diplomats working in Iraq.
- 3. Private funding.

II. Admission Requirements:

- 1. The applicant must hold an Iraqi preparatory certificate or its equivalent.
- 2. The maximum years after graduation of preparatory certificate must be three years in morning classes for the slots (I 1,2) above, and four years for the slot (I 3) with the exception of admission for the evening classes.
- 3. The applicant must meet the minimum GPA requirements for admission for the following colleges:
- 90% for Medical specialties.
- 80% for Engineering specialties.
- 70% for Pure science.
- 65% Law / Political Science.
- 60% for other specializations.
- 4. The tuition fees are collected from applicants accepted on the morning funded public education slot are shown in table (1). As for applicants for evening classes, the fees are shown in table (2).

- 5. Those who are accepted into evening classes are excluded from the requirement of the graduation year for high school.
- 6. The applicant should submit a health certificate confirming that s/he is free from diseases, in addition to passing the health checkup, according to the conditions of each program of study.
- 7. The applicant or the official nominating body shall pay the annual registration fee at the beginning of each academic year either in foreign currency or its equivalent in Iraqi dinars in accordance with the agreed upon executive program between the two countries.

III. Documents required to apply:

- An equivalent preparatory certificate validated by the authority that issued it, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the country from which it was issued, and the Iraqi embassy in that country. As for the applicants who hold the Iraqi preparatory school certificate, they must submit the certificate validated by the General Directorate of Education in the governorate in which the applicant completed his/her program of study.
- Original birth certificate or certified copy.
- A copy of the passport.
- Two personal photos.
- The applicant should fill out the application form for each slot.
- The deadline of submission is 1/10/2023.

IV. Scholarships for expats who have a certificate equivalent to the Iraqi preparatory certificate in the bachelor study:

- 1. The admission due to the valid programs and agreements with Arab and foreign countries (cultural exchange). The terms and conditions of the scholarship shall be in accordance with what has been agreed upon with those programs and agreements between the two countries. The Directorate of Studies, Planning and Follow-up shall be provided with the terms of the agreement (copies of those programs or agreements) with regard to the Bachelor studies exclusively to work according to what is stated therein.
- 2. The admission according to the scholarships awarded to the Association of Arab Universities:
- a. The Directorate of Studies, Planning and Follow-up is provided with scholarships allocated to the Association of Arab Universities, according to specialization, and with regard to the Bachelor studies exclusively, and the admission procedures are completed by them.
- b. The Directorate of Scholarships and Cultural Relations shall facilitate the procedures for granting visas (in cooperation with the Ministries of Interior and Foreign Affairs) for applicants covered by the grants in article (2) above, while notifying the Security Permits Office for each case.
- c. Allocating 1% of the admission plan in the college and for each specialization for these scholarships.
- d. The minimum limits for admission to the Bachelor Studies are as follows:
 - The medical colleges (general medicine), with an average of (85%).
 - Specializations of the engineering colleges with an average of (65%).
 - Other scientific and human specialties with an average of (60%).
 - The age of the applicant for a bachelor's studies should not exceed (24) years.
- e. Universities are responsible for the expenses of study and housing in the case that there are dormitories at the university campus (full scholarship) or a partial scholarship in the absence of dormitories.
- f. The admission plan is sent to the Directorate of Scholarships and Cultural Relations to coordinate with the Association of Arab Universities in accordance with the mechanisms previously used by them.

- 3. Scholarships granted to non-Iraqi students residing in Iraq for ten years or more) in Iraqi universities according to the available specialties in those universities:
- a. The submission for scholarships is exclusively through the Directorate of Studies, Planning and Follow-up Admission Department, Expats Division.
- b. Allocating 2% of the college admission plan for the grants to Arab and foreign students residing in Iraq for ten years or more.
- c. The applicant should file a request to the university in which s/he wishes to study, given the submission of the equivalency of the applicant's preparatory school and verifying that s/he meets the admission requirements according to the scholarship, provided that the university is referred to the effective terms stipulated in the Student Affairs Procedures Manual according to what is stated therein. The universities must adhere to the specified proportions in the admission plan. The public universities should undertake the procedures of validity of the issuance of the student's academic documents and within maximum of the first academic year of admission.
- d. The minimum limits for admission to the bachelor studies are set according to the admission of their peers of Iraqi students on the funded public education, and according to the year of graduation of the student from preparatory school.
- e. The age of the applicant for a bachelor's degree should not exceed (24) years.
- f. Universities are responsible for the expenses of study and housing in the case that there are dormitories at the university campus (full scholarship) or a partial scholarship in the absence of dormitories.
- 4. Scholarships granted to non-Iraqi students (non-residents in Iraq and those coming from abroad for the purposes of (studying in Iraqi universities) according to the available specialties in those universities:
- a. The submission for scholarships is exclusively through the Directorate of Studies, Planning and Follow-up Admission Department, Expats Division.
- b. Allocating 3% of the college admission plan for the grants to Arab and foreign students residing in Iraq for the purpose of study.
- c. The applicant should file a request to the university in which s/he wishes to study, given the submission of the equivalency of the applicant's preparatory

school and verifying that s/he meets the admission requirements according to the scholarship, provided that the university is referred to the effective terms stipulated in the Student Affairs Procedures Manual according to what is stated therein. The universities must adhere to the specified proportions in the admission plan. The public universities should undertake the procedures of validity of the issuance of the student's academic documents and within maximum of the first academic year of admission.

- d. The minimum limits for admission to the Bachelor Studies are as follows:
 - The medical colleges (general medicine) with an average of (85%) and the specialization in dentistry and pharmacy with an average of (75%).
 - Specializations of the engineering and nursing colleges with an average of (65%).
 - Other scientific and human specialties with an average of (60%).
- e. The age of the applicant for a bachelor's studies should not exceed (24) years.
- f. Universities are responsible for the expenses of study and housing in the case that there are dormitories at the university campus (full scholarship) or a partial scholarship in the absence of dormitories.
